Description	
<i>Provide a short description of the event and its activities.</i>	

The project responded to the call of the Citizens, Equality, Rights and Values (CERV) program. The project was scheduled for a three-day event, in which activities of a diverse nature for the target group alternated. The aim of the project was to promote equality, solidarity and awareness among EU citizens. The three-day event was held in the premises of the village of Tesedikovo, which was the main applicant for the project. The implementation of the project was based on an existing partnership with municipalities in the Slovak Republic, Hungary and Romania. The target group of the project was the citizens of the applicant municipality and partner municipalities such as Zemne, Tab, Nagyrede and Baile Tusnad. In addition, residents of the border regions of the identified municipalities took part in the event, too.

All age categories were involved in sports, cultural and educational activities, regardless of nationality or gender. The project was scheduled for 3 days so that the individual activities were alternated and ensured the sustainability of the participants in their full commitment of concentration and interest. Every day was different. The activities were designed so that their content was suitable for everyone, regardless of age, gender or nationality. We applied equality for all. We emphasized the fact that it doesn't matter whether one is a man or a woman, equality was important for everyone - it was necessary to have informed, responsible and committed participants not only of the entire event, but also to transfer the acquired skills and knowledge to everyday life. The concept and the actual implementation of the project were carried out in the spirit of the idea that we are all equal = we all have the same rights. Seniors and children were also involved in the program.

The first day was mainly devoted to welcoming not only the representatives of individual partner municipalities but also the participants themselves to each other. We started with a performance by local children and youth of the main organizer of Tesedikovo village. We prepared a meeting of representatives of the partner municipalities around one table, where space was created to build a new story for Europe. We focused on consolidating the acquired information about the EU in the activity entitled What do you already know about the EU? This activity was designed for anybody regardless of age, gender, nationality or religion. It was presented under the supervision of trained workers who are familiar with the given topic, which ensured accurate and truthful presentation of information appropriate to the age and possibility of absorbing everything new by the participants of the event. The sports activity created a relaxed atmosphere in which all participants were equal to each other. There was space for free conversations and the formation of friendships.

The second day of the event was held in the spirit of educational activities, in which we interspersed the areas of EU topics. By organizing creative workshops focused on the idea of volunteering, we pointed out the importance of the involvement of marginalized groups of the population in everyday life. There were also activities connected with demonstrating love for culture and national traditions. We had prepared a varied program in the form of dance, folk songs and handicraft demonstrations. Space for free conversations was created with the possibility of tasting local traditional delicacies. Each participant found something that interested and fulfilled them at the same time. We united the generations into one whole, thereby breaking down intergenerational barriers and creating a unity of partnership between the countries of Slovakia, Hungary and Romania. Throughout the day, materials about the EU were made available, so lecturers and experts who know the subject and deal with it on a daily basis, were available. AWARENESS was the basis for the development of an aware and educated society of the individual countries involved in the project.

We devoted the last day of the event to EU values, freedom of expression, and thinking about the future of the EU. We had prepared a beautiful activity in the form of drawing the participants of the event into the world of creativity. Participants had the opportunity to show their hidden talents and the potential of creative thinking. There was an opportunity to show the importance of involving seniors in everyday life. We focused on presenting the exceptional features and characters of seniors for the younger generation.

EU themes were lightened by sports activities, where space was created for relaxation and natural competition. We have prepared an interesting activity in the form of "Design what the EU character should look like". As part of the "Let's sweeten our lives" activity, we prepared a joint baking of children and youth with seniors. The afternoon program focused on the future of the EU, where we will move and what kind of cooperation we will create with our partner municipalities. We focused our attention on the young generation, in whom we hope for a possible change in the understanding of political contexts in the EU area.
